The Conservative Party of Canada, formerly the governing party in Canada, is a political party in Canada. The party is currently led by Andrew Scheer, who succeeded John Ford, the party leader from 2006 to 2017, who had been the party leader since 2002. The party did not elect a member of its Board of Directors to sit on the Board of Directors of the party. The party was founded in 1867, the year of the Confederation of Canada. The party is currently a member of the following political parties: Partido Conservador de Canadá, anteriormente la formación gobernante de Canadá. The next election was held in 1978, when the party dropped from 56 to 32 seats and a majority of seats in the House of Commons. Fusion of the two parties for the February 25, 1987 election was the first time the party had more than one member elected. On the night of the election, Ford received a late-night call from then-Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau that resulted in his resignation as leader of the party. The party faced two other major political events. First, the federal government passed legislation to abolish the Senate of Canada in 1996, eliminating the opposition's majority in that chamber. Second, in the April 1997 referendum to approve the Charlottetown Accord, an agreement reached between the federal government and five of the six parties who participated in the agreement, the party gained a majority of seats in the House of Commons with 46 seats. The party was initially against the Canadian Forces, and favoured fewer and smaller borders. The party supported unilateral disarmament, and was opposed to the North American Free Trade Agreement, international agreements, and to the United Nations. In its first term the party dominated Quebec and was one of Canada's two major parties, while it was the official opposition in the rest of the country. Ford's term as party leader was marked by much controversy. Conservative policies led to the party's decline in popularity; the party was considered an economic conservative, but less so on social issues. This was particularly true in Canada's francophone province of Quebec, where opposition parties were better known for their social policies. The federal Progressive Conservative Party of Canada was founded in 1867 as the parliamentary wing of the Conservative Party of Canada, but was split in two in October 1879 due to an internal dispute. The Canadian House of Commons adopted a resolution on 19 December 1971 that "notes with satisfaction that the present Constitution of the House 82157476af
